Practitioner Article

Sometimes, along the path, we get knocked off into the ditch, so to speak. We ask ourselves, "How am I going to get through this; the further I go, the worse it gets?" We try to



pray, but we are so involved emotionally, that all we can see is the problem. There is an answer we can call a Practitioner and they can help us to see the truth, because "the truth will set us free".

These are people who have taken all the class work and have received training on how to assist you in finding the answer, and also assist you in your prayer work. They see the situation you are in, but without the negative emotion and are not wrapped up in it. They can see the truth and speak it into existence. For example, if your child is sick, you know the truth about that child - that they are usually whole and well, but all you can see is the pain they are experiencing. The Practitioner, not being as emotionally involved as you, the parent, can speak the word of health and through the creative law of mind, will produce it in like form (well and whole).

Many times, I have used a Practitioner and have received great demonstrations. I believe it is one of the best things we have going in our church. They are dedicated to their practice and have great spiritual insight.



Meet the Center's New Music Director Brad Rissau

Brad and his family have been coming to Big Bear Lake since he was a child and built their home in Big Bear City in 1961. He's been back in town since 2006 after a long stint on the East coast where his band, "Porch Chops", has performed since 1988.

Since returning to Bear Valley, he's performed stints in the bands, "A Full Deck", "Skeleton Key Band", Bear Valley Crackerz", "Porch Jones", and for the past 6 years, "Silver Moon". His repertoire includes over 6,000 songs that span many genres and over 150 years of popular song. "I'd say I was a song collector as well as a singer, musician and songwriter. A good song is my missionary work – bringing someone some joy, relief, perspective and nostalgia in this complicated path we call living", Brad says.

Having owned a record store in Wilmington, Delaware, as well as serving as a publicist on over 130 Grammy-nominated records for artists as diverse as Willie Nelson, Bruce Hornsby, Hervie Hancock, Derek Trucks and countless others, he's had experience in many facets of the music business. He booked concerts in San Diego in the mid-70's, produced local and national artists on both coasts (including records featuring members of the Rolling Stones, Sheryl Crow,



Norah Jones), and worked in the studio and on releases featuring Steely Dan, Elvis Costello, Marian McPartland, to name a few.

He's released 15 CDs of material over the years and has written over 400 original compositions. Brad is a meditator and student of Eastern Philosophy, is a published poet and worked as a music columnist for national magazines; "Jazziz Magazine, "Dupree's Diamond News". He has also served as a food critic for "Big Bear Today".

"Since I first heard Louis Armstrong on my Dad's record player and saw "The Beatles" on Ed Sullivan, music has provided a forum for my creative impulses and a solace and motivational tool for some of the best inspiring discoveries, close friendships, and personal experiences over the years."

As jazz great Ornette Coleman whispered into Brad's ear after accepting a Grammy for Lifetime Achievement, "Sound is life".
